

Graduating Students and Preparing Them for Their Postsecondary Pursuits

By every metric, the highest-performing high schools in Detroit are all charter schools (schools that don't require high test scores for admittance). Considered the gold standard of school rankings, the U.S. News and World Report rankings of the Best High Schools in America have been announced for 2025 and JRLA ranks No. 2 in the city for open enrollment schools. JRLA also ranks No. 6 among all high schools in Detroit, including the selective enrollment schools. JRLA is also a leader in Detroit for college matriculation and although we are proud of our accomplishments, we know we must continuously strive for improvement.

All students do not have equal access to a quality education. Despite major strides toward educational equity, our country still faces an opportunity gap. An education should not be defined by socioeconomic background, abilities, or zip code! That is why Jalen Rose and Michael A. Carter, Sr. founded JRLA — an open enrollment, tuition free, public charter high school in their hometown of Detroit.

In partnership with NAF, JRLA now offers a Career and Technical Education (CTE) program with pathways in Health Sciences, Education and Business. The program provides scholars with the skills and knowledge they need to enter the work force with a certification or pursue further education in a specific career field.

Beyond academics, JRLA is also committed to serving the broader community through a partnership with Forgotten Harvest. Staff, scholars and local volunteers were able to come together to fight hunger and food insecurity by distributing fresh and nutritious food free of charge to our community every Wednesday.

Next Big Challenge

According to the 2024 Michigan School Data (MISD) College Dashboard, the average 6-year college completion rate for all Michigan students is **57.7%**. This rate is lower than the 2023 national average of **62.3%**.

Founded on a 9-16 model (to and through college), we are on a mission to not only graduate our scholars from high school, but get them to graduate from college or a postsecondary program as well – outcomes that are real game changers in urban public education.

With the support of corporate and individual donors, JRLA distributed \$142K in 2025 for scholarships bringing the cumulative total to \$1.916 Million in private scholarship dollars for our scholars and alumni. These funds help decrease the gap of the full cost of college after financial aid, grants and loans. Every scholar who applied for an in-house scholarship received funding for college to assist them on their path to greatness.

JRLA is one of the few high schools in the state that employs full-time staff to work with the school's alumni. Scholars receive the support they need during their postsecondary pursuits with the hope they will earn a college degree or trade certification. The school is committed to going above and beyond what a traditional public school would provide so its scholars can compete in a global economy.

Opportunities to Invest in the Scholars of JRLA



Funding a public charter high school is not an easy task, especially in Detroit. Per pupil spending varies significantly across the United States. For example, this upcoming school year, JRLA will receive roughly \$10,000 per pupil in state aid, significantly less than our suburban counterparts and well below the national average of over \$16,645. In addition, states like New York are allocating over \$35,000 for each pupil.

Michigan charter schools do not receive funding to purchase, lease, or improve their facilities. This causes financial challenges that can limit our ability to reach our ambitious educational goals and provide appropriate accommodations. To fully prepare our students for their postsecondary pursuits, we need to raise significant funds from private sources (individuals, corporations and foundations) to bridge the gap. We are seeking contributions to support areas such as...



School sponsored college visits and campus tours to increase college enrollment and persistence



Technology including additional laptops, tablets and smart boards for access to interactive learning software



Summer Learning Adventure which includes placement of students in business and professional internships - you can't dream about what you've never seen



Benefits for our staff that go above and beyond including higher starting salaries, merit increases, performance bonuses, longevity bonuses and PTO payout



Extra-curricular activities that improve college acceptance and support college success as well as athletic programs that instill teamwork, leadership and hard work



Scholarship funds to close the gap between the rising costs of college and available financial aid so all students can attend the schools that accept them



In May of this year, Henry Ford Health donated their Kingswood facility to JRLA for our expansion efforts. The high school plans to transition to this location for the 2027-28 school year and convert the current campus into a middle school. We are embarking on a \$25 Million capital campaign to support the retrofit and renovations, which will include more classroom space, a weight room, a full size gymnasium and other offerings.
