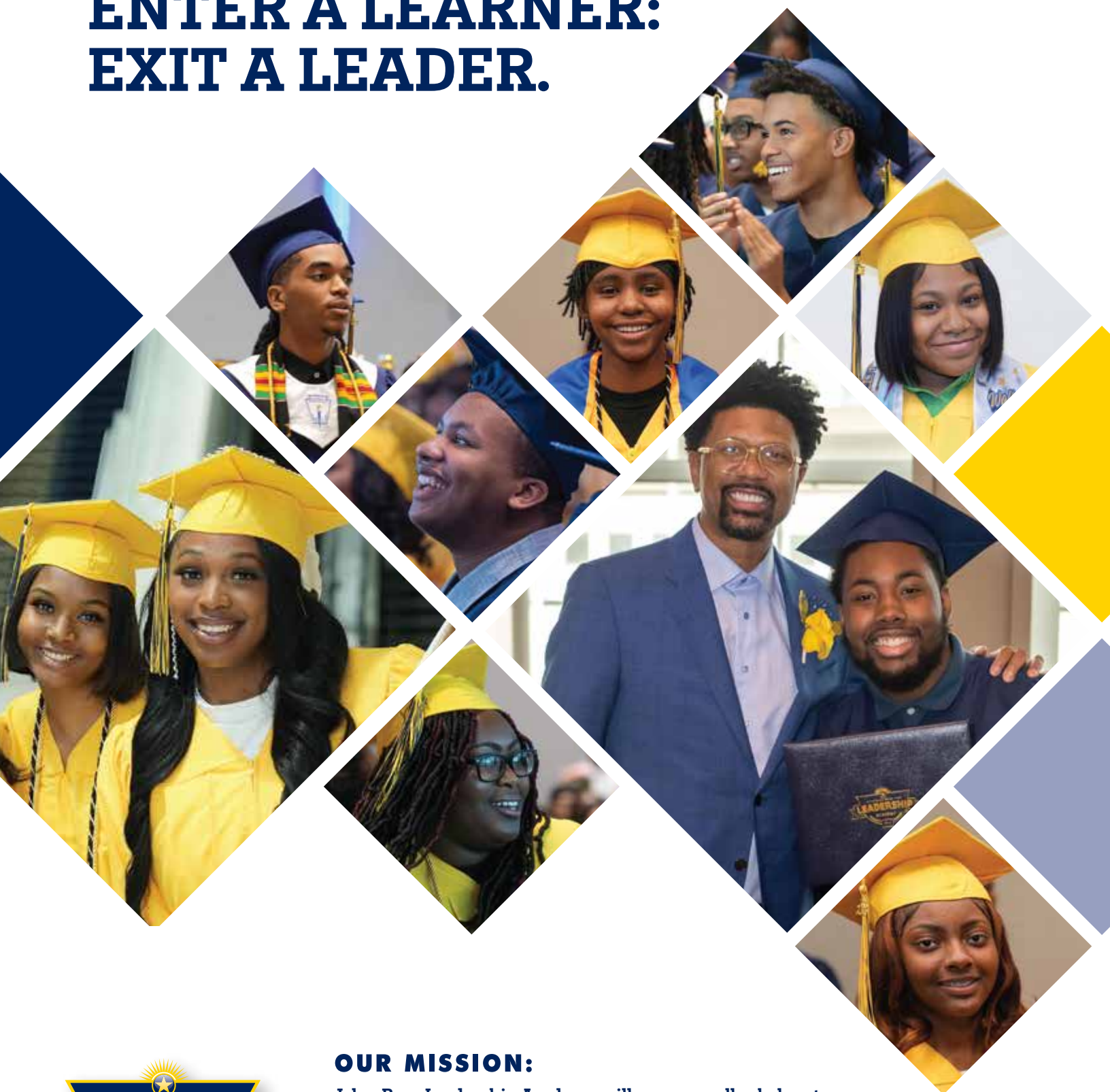

Numbers Tell the Story

97%

graduation rate, equal to rates of suburban high schools

100%

of JRLA graduates have been accepted to college or technical school

71%

of JRLA graduates have matriculated to college within a year of graduation, compared to a state average of 65%

All students do not have equal access to a quality education. Despite major strides toward educational equity, our country still faces an opportunity gap. An education should not be defined by socioeconomic background, abilities, or zip code! That is why Jalen Rose and Michael A. Carter, Sr. founded JRLA - an open enrollment, tuition free, public charter high school in their hometown of Detroit.

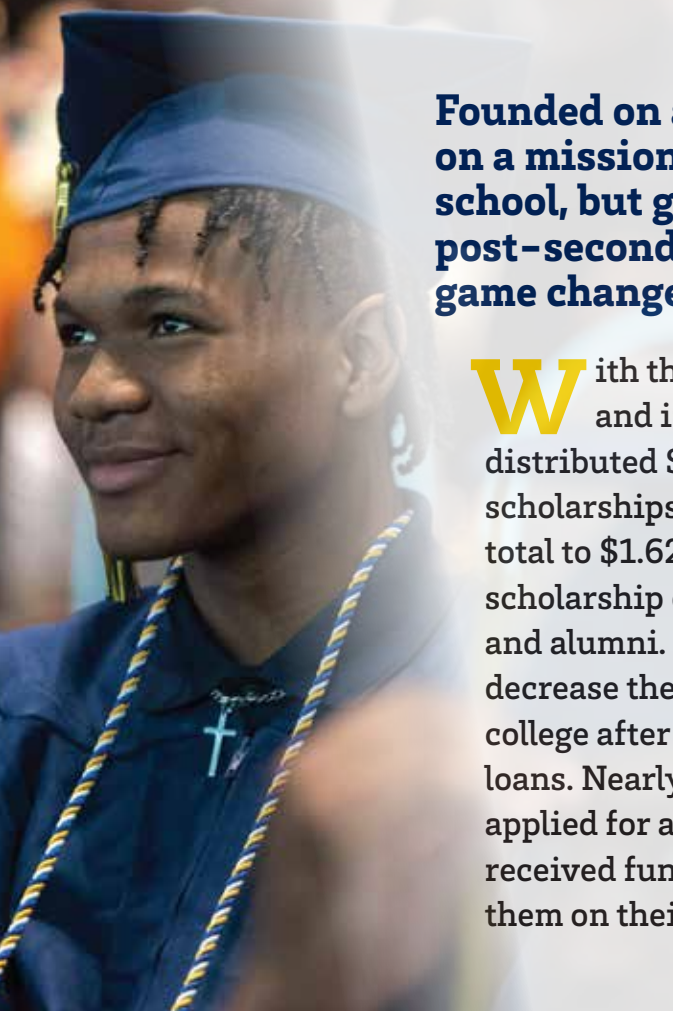
Next Big Challenge

According to the MI School Data (March 2023), the most recent 6-year college completion rate (students who started college in Fall 2016) for Michigan students is **59%**, down slightly from the previous year. Getting our scholars to persist through college is our next big challenge.

Founded on a 9–16 model (to and through college), we are on a mission to not only graduate our scholars from high school, but get them to graduate from college or a post-secondary program as well—outcomes that are real game changers in urban public education.

With the support of corporate and individual donors, JRLA distributed \$128K in 2023 for scholarships bringing the cumulative total to \$1.628 Million in private scholarship dollars for our scholars and alumni. These funds help decrease the gap of the full cost of college after financial aid, grants and loans. Nearly every scholar who applied for an in-house scholarship received funding for college to assist them on their path to greatness.

JRLA is one of the few high schools in the state that employs full-time staff to work with the school's alumni. Scholars receive the support they need during their post-secondary pursuits with the hope they will earn a college degree or trade certification. The school is committed to going above and beyond what a traditional public school would provide so its scholars can compete in a global economy.

The JRLA Board of Directors collaboratively designed an academic program based on the "Big 3" key predictors of college success: 1) mastery of academic skills and content knowledge; 2) the development of academic habits and soft skills like perseverance and self-advocacy; and 3) the cultivation of identity, relevance, and belonging. By targeting each of these areas, JRLA graduates are much more ready to succeed when they step onto a college campus.

- Expectation that **all will graduate and enroll** in a post-secondary program
- A **Summer Learning Adventure** with real world exposure including an international trip, programs on college campuses, and internships with local businesses to prepare for a global economy
- College Prep academic offerings including **Advanced Placement** and **Dual Enrollment** courses
- A robust **college counseling system** that requires every student to apply to multiple colleges, pursue available financial aid, and helps students and their families select the best post-secondary fit
- Full-time **Alumni Success Counselors** to work with students once they are in college to provide the support they need to stay and earn a degree
- Strong, enduring relationships between each student and an **adult Advisor** at the school





In their school management efforts, they partner with communities and equip school leaders and educators with the tools they need to lead high-quality, high-performing schools.

Opportunities to Invest in the Scholars of JRLA

Funding a public charter high school is not an easy task, especially in Detroit. Per pupil spending varies significantly across states in the United States. For example, this upcoming school year, JRLA will only receive \$9,608 per pupil in state aid while some of our suburban counterparts will receive significantly more. In addition, states like New York are allocating over \$25,000 for each pupil. Unlike traditional public schools,

Michigan charter schools do not receive funding to purchase, lease, or improve their facilities. This causes financial challenges that can limit our ability to reach our ambitious educational goals and provide appropriate accommodations. To fully prepare our students for their post-secondary pursuits, we need to raise significant funds from private sources (individuals, corporations and foundations) to bridge our gap. We are seeking contributions to support areas such as...



School sponsored college visits and campus tours to increase college enrollment and persistence

Technology including additional laptops, tablets and smart boards for access to interactive learning software

Summer Learning Adventure which includes placement of students in business and professional internships - you can't dream about what you've never seen

Enough teachers to keep classes at 25 students or less

Extra-curricular activities that improve college acceptance and support college success as well as athletic programs that instill teamwork, leadership and hard work

Scholarship funds to close the gap between the rising costs of college and available financial aid so all students can attend the schools that accept them

Capital campaign to support a much needed building expansion to include a high school gymnasium and additional classrooms

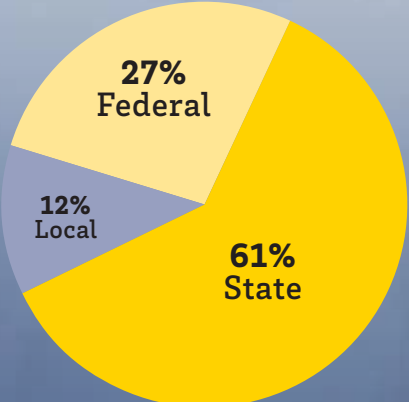
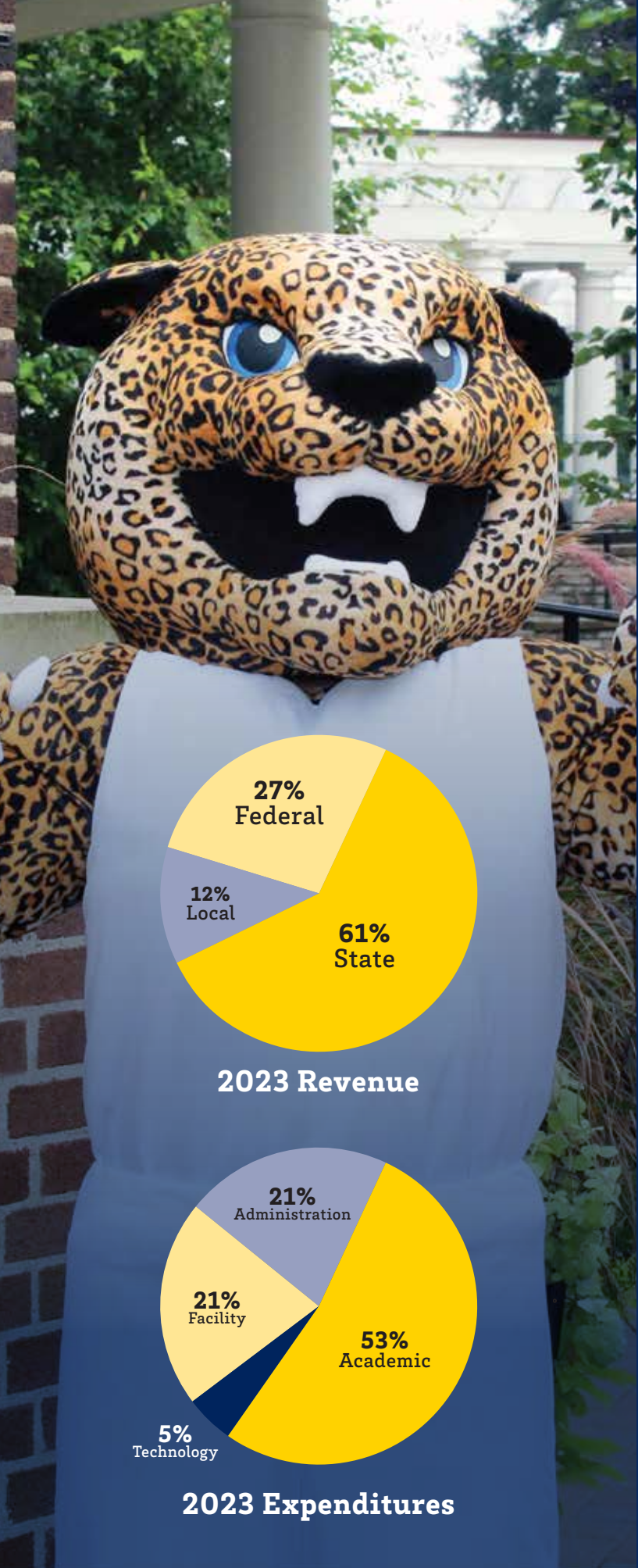

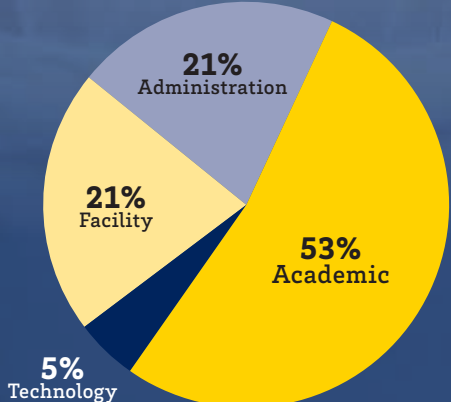
